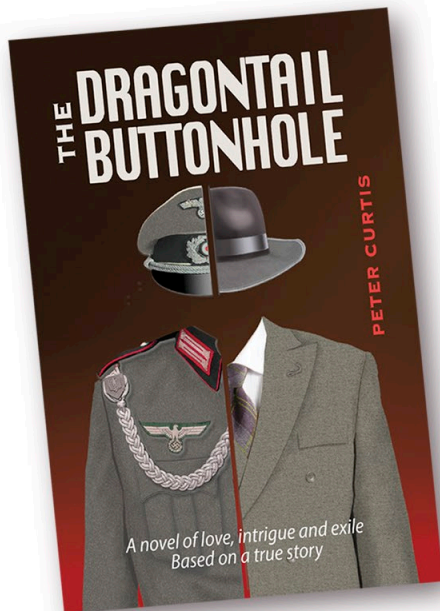
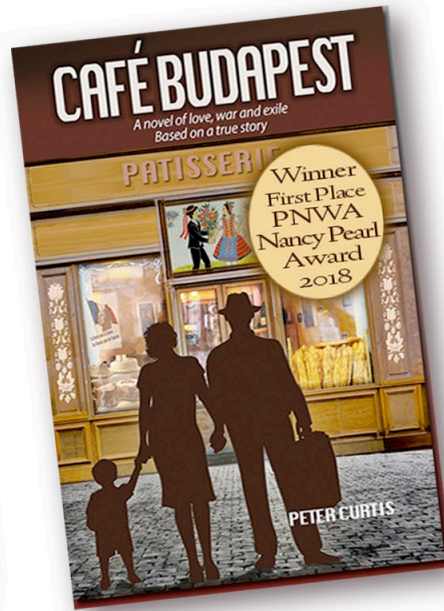


The Kohut Trilogy: Escape, Survival, Assimilation
